

Welcome to the Global Landscapes Forum, Kyoto Conference

n May 13, the world's leading experts on climate change will gather for the Global Landscapes Forum in Kyoto, Japan, 22 years after the signing of the Kyoto Protocol, the first legally binding treaty to cut greenhouse gases.

GLF Kyoto 2019 will focus on how we can tackle climate change from the landscape. On May 13, experts from science, business, policy, international development and more will come join in person - and online from around the world, to focus on sustainable landscapes as one of the keys to climate mitigation and adaptation. The livestreamed talks at the Kyoto International Conference Center, complemented by a comprehensive digital edition with live discussions from five continents, will analyze on-the-ground solutions for the challenges highlighted by the UN Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change and in meetings taking place alongside GLF Kyoto.

To keep global temperature rise below 1.5 degrees Celsius in accordance with targets included in the 2015 UN Paris Agreement on climate change, we need radical change - change that is systemic, global, organizational, governmental and personal.

The people most often found at the forefront of radical change are artists, activists, change agents, youth, local communities, women, Indigenous peoples and influencers.

Reflecting the need for joined up thinking, inclusive perspectives and a grasp of the big picture, we are weaving together a global narrative from those who are radical change makers on the front lines, behind the scenes, who are changing paradigms, creating new thinking and moving forward with courageous action.
