By recognizing Indigenous Peoples and local communities as rights-holders and bearers of solutions, as opposed to mere "beneficiaries" of proposed development and climate interventions within their own landscapes, the GLF aims to foster new forms of collaboration, anchored in a common understanding that justice and equity are essential to sustainable and inclusive development.






Venue map
